Spirit in Practice

Meditation, Worship, Justice-Making, and Other Spiritual Practices for UU Adults

The Lifespan Faith Development staff group of the Unitarian Universalist Association is seeking congregations, camps, and conference centers to field test ten workshops on UU spiritual practices between January and June 2008. The workshops can be offered as drop-in programs or as a course with continuous enrollment. They are appropriate for evening meetings or Sunday morning adult forums. *The program will be in its field test phase.* Therefore, congregations will commit to providing feedback (by June 30, 2008) which will guide revisions to the program before publication. Workshops are each 60 to 90 minutes in length and adaptable for your needs.

Drawing on a model developed by the Zen Mountain Monastery for the training of its students, *Spirit in Practice* proposes eight “spheres” for a holistic and whole hearted spiritual quest, each of which is available to Unitarian Universalists of all spiritual and theological orientations. The spheres are:

- ⌘ Personal spiritual practices;
- ⌘ Communal worship experiences;
- ⌘ Spiritual partnerships;
- ⌘ Mind practices;
- ⌘ Body practices;
- ⌘ Soul practices;
- ⌘ Life practices; and
- ⌘ Justice practices.
