### *HOT Off The Press*

We are pleased to announce the publication of a new Tapestry curriculum: [Resistance and Transformation: Unitarian Universalist Social Justice History](#), written by the Reverend Colin Bossen and the Reverend Julia Hamilton. This meticulously researched program includes sixteen, 90-minute workshops that revolve around the stories of Unitarian, Universalist, or Unitarian Universalist involvement in social justice struggles. It provides an opportunity to delve into primary source material, to hear stories less commonly told, and to make connections between this history and modern UU practice. Themes include abolition, peace-making, civil rights, free speech, utopianism, counter-culture, women's movements, sexuality education, and GLBT equality.

## *One Useful Tool*

### *F A C E B O O K*

Ever wonder about how to optimize Facebook for your professional use? The following tip from Evan Sutton, Leadership Training Director at the New Organizing Institute can help you:

*When I was first organizing, I didn't want to reject or ignore friend requests from volunteers, but I also didn't want them to see the pictures of my night at Karaoke or random comments about TV shows. That's when I discovered the magic that is Friend Lists. You can create as many lists as you need, then manage individual content pieces (like photo albums, links and status posts) based on those lists. Setting up lists and privacy settings is easy.*

- 1. Under "Account," choose "Edit Friends," then "Create a List"*
- 2. Give your list a name, like "Coworkers," then select the friends you want on that list*
- 3. Back under "Account," select "Account Settings" then "Privacy"*
- 4. For each type of content (Photos, Status Updates, etc.), choose "Custom" and specify who can and can't see that type of content by default*
- 5. Any time you make a new friend, just place that person on the appropriate list(s) (when you send a Friend Request, you can specify which list(s) the person belongs to before requesting)*

*This can be used for a lot more than privacy. I keep an "Organizers" list, for example, and can send invites, updates or requests just to other organizers.*
