## *One Thing Going On*

### *Youth Leadership Opportunities*

Passionate, dynamic, energized youth leaders are sought to help shape youth involvement at Justice GA 2012 and beyond! Applications are now being accepted for two key positions with the General Assembly Youth Caucus: HUUPER and FUN TIMES Manager. HUUPERS, or Hardcore Unitarian Universalist People Energized and Ready, serve as co-deans of the Youth Caucus for a two-year term, and work collaboratively with other youth and adults to shape Youth Caucus programming and youth involvement in General Assembly. FUN TIMES Managers are the business co-managers for FUN TIMES (Folks Unanimously Networking To Imagine, Manage and Execute Sessions) and also serve a two-year term guiding youth through the business of General Assembly and also providing them with opportunities to interact with Association leaders and discover ways to engage in the work of the Association.

If there is an enthusiastic, collaborative youth leader in your congregation, encourage them to apply! Successful applicants will be high-school aged youth for the two years of their term and will have experience leading groups of youth and adults. Prior GA attendance is not required for HUUPER. ### *Young Adult Service Journal*

“Serve in Spirit,” the Young Adult Service Journal, is a resource designed to combine the concepts of spirituality and service in a cohesive fashion. While Young Adults engage in service work in the United States and overseas, it is essential that they have a tool that effectively guides their reflective process through a potentially life changing and transformative experience. The journal addresses the three stages of a service project (before, during, and after), as each are distinct and require focused attention. The journal includes quotes, readings, and questions all existing for the purpose of nurturing Young Adults in the exploration of their identity, their relationship to Unitarian Universalism, and their place in the world. While targeted to Young Adults, this journal can be used as model for theological reflection by anyone engaging in service work or social justice projects.
