

The Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians in northern Michigan joined at least two other American Indian tribes in passing a law that explicitly allows for same-sex marriage. Shortly thereafter a wedding was held on the reservation for a same-sex couple. Thanks to the recent Supreme Court decision, their union will be federally recognized.
