Now is the time to pass the Gulf Coast Civic Works Act

To My Fellow Unitarian Universalists,

On May 5, Representative Zoe Lofgren introduced the **Gulf Coast Civic Works Act**. This bill would create 100,000 prevailing wage jobs and training opportunities for local and displaced workers on projects that would restore infrastructure and the coastal environment with green building technologies. This program would empower residents to realize their right to return and create stronger, safer, and more equitable communities.

Four years after Hurricanes Katrina and Rita, the Gulf Coast is yet to be rebuilt. President Obama characterized the federal response to the storms and levee breaches as "unconscionable ineptitude" and campaigned on a platform which judged the recovery "a national shame." But today, New Orleans' levees are still vulnerable, tens of thousands of people haven't been able to return home, and affordable housing and living wage jobs are scarce. Help bring justice to the Gulf Coast by urging Congress to support the Gulf Coast Civic Works Act.
